Mullen, Chief of Naval Operations, dated September 12, 2005. As we could expect, his direct quote was: "The Seabees are repairing infrastructure and clearing debris at such a pace they have actually inspired local citizens to feel more optimistic about the future. "The last paragraph said it all: "At NAS New Orleans I came across a bunch of Seabees working feverishly on the wooden platform for what was going to be a temporary dining facility. It was a contract job, but the contractor was having problems rounding up the necessary manpower and resources. The Seabees didn't ask permission, didn't wait for orders, they simply rolled up their sleeves and went to work." "Hey, they needed help," one said, "and we know how to do this stuff." We do, indeed, know how to do this stuff, and we are doing it extremely well. Standing amongst them, I was never more proud to call myself an American Sailor."

This is definitely a proud moment for all of us who understand the "Can Do" spirit of the Seabees. We, as members of NMCB-8, have had the opportunity to serve with the greatest group of Seabees ever put together.

VOICES FROM THE DAST

I am so glad I was contacted by **Ron Dougal** who introduced me to the NMCB-8 Association. I served in NMCB-8 Alpha Company 1966-1969. I have several remembrances. One that seems like yesterday started in EO "A" School, Port Hueneme.

I had a mentor in MCB-8 named **CPO Frash**. He was one of my instructors in "A" School. I then worked for him on the Chu Lai deployment in the rock quarry. He was also my Chief on detachment in Tam Mi (Malfunction Junction) on the Phu Bai deployment.

Ever have a really bad day in MCB-8? I have had several. While on detachment, one project was laying dredged sand as highway base through the rice paddies. One afternoon Chief Frash assigned me to operate the TS-24 scraper. The very first run I loaded up a full load of sand and headed for the dump site. As I arrived at the site, I began slowing down to open the apron and empty the sand. The scraper started bouncing. When it jumped so high that I lost control, the scraper transported me and the full load of sand right into the adjacent rice paddy. It sunk so deep there was no way to drive it back out. Needless to say the Chief was a little upset. He handed me a shovel and ordered me to start digging out the scraper and its load of sand until he could get a Marine Corps tank retriever to pull it out. Still sorry chief. When it was pulled out, the job was reassigned to other operators including "Squeaky" Larry Hansel. I should have learned when in "A" school bulldozer training that if we ever ran out of fuel, the Chief would make us fill it up with a coke bottle.

EDITORS NOTE: At our May, 2005 reunion in Port Hueneme, your shipmates who were present voted to donate \$1,500 to a worthy cause in the memory of Pap Phelps, EIGHT's Commanding Officer who died last December after a long battle with cancer. Originally, we thought a donation to the Seabee Museum Fund or the Seabee Memorial Scholarship Fund would be appropriate. However, when Hurricane Katrina hit the Gulf Coast in September, there was a quick change in direction. A decision was made to send our contribution to the Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society (NMCRS) to support those families in

need at Gulfport as a result of the Katrina disaster.

Even while they and their families suffered the aftermath of the storm, Seabees from several battalions, some of whom had just returned from Iraq, pitched in to provide immediate emergency help throughout the Gulfport/Biloxi and New Orleans area. The Chief of Naval Operations, in a speech given shortly after the disaster, mentioned the Seabees, twice as he described what military personnel were doing, in a most positive way, to help out in the relief effort throughout the region.
